Deep Water Swimming sessions for Y6 pupils at Haverhill Leisure Centre	£73.00	To ensure that Year 6 children have an opportunity to swim in a 'deep water pool' and are able to demonstrate their 25m in this pool, this is also used as a preparation for year 6 residential which are mainly water activities	The confident swimmers enjoyed the change in pool for these sessions. The less confident swimmers found this a real challenge and highlighted the need for deep water swim sessions to take place. We will evaluate the frequency of them for next year and look at introducing them for the less able swimmers in Year 5.

Other equipment purchases throughout the year	Unknown	Fully stocked PE shed which enables teachers to teach all areas of the curriculum, including new hockey equipment. Enough equipment to keep all children fully engaged in the lesson.	New equipment purchased for the hockey team, enabling them to compete and take part in local competitions.
